They will also commission an artist to paint a portrait of your pet for €150–€350 (32 rue de Turbigo; 1/42-71-59-09). **PINCELOUP**, owned by fashion designer and dog owner Couli Jobert, sells gorgeous handcrafted, shamrock-studded leather collars and leashes for €50–€75, as well as pet beds for €90–€290, chew toys for €8–€19, and adorable doggy sunglasses for €30–€40, depending on size (53 quai des Grands-Augustins; 1/44-41-14-74). **LES CADORS MARAIS** and the new **LES CADORS ST GERMAIN** offer handmade cashmere sweaters to keep treasured pets warm in winter for €109–€119 (12 rue Ferdinand Duval, 1/44-59-30-46, and 11 rue Princess, 1/43-29-90-17). —Stephanie Ager Kirz
